

Beach Handball World Championships

1st Beach Handball World Championship in El Gouna EGY 2004, Nov 27 - 30

The inaugural World Championship, originally planned for February 2001 in Rio de Janeiro BRA, was not held because beach handball had been accepted as a demonstration sport for the 6th World Games in August 2001.

Qualifications

Men: From Africa no team is nominated. The IHF awarded the African spot to the 6th ranked team of the European Championship 2004 **HUN**. Hosts **EGY** get a bye.

The winners of Asian Championship 2004 **OMA** qualify.

The top four teams of the European Championship 2004 **RUS**, **GER**, **TUR** and **ESP** qualify. As **GER** and **ESP** withdrew only 5th ranked **UKR** is nominated.

The top three teams of Pan American Championship 2004 **BRA**, **URU** and **ARG** qualify. As **URU** and **ARG** withdrew the 2nd ranked team of Asian Championship 2004 **BRN** and the 7th ranked of European Championship 2004 **CRO** are nominated.

Women: From Africa no team is nominated. The IHF awarded the African spot to the 5th ranked team of the European Championship 2004 **TUR**.

The winners of Asian Championship 2004 **JPN** qualify.

The top three teams of European Championship 2004 **RUS**, **CRO** and **GER** qualify. As **GER** withdrew the 4th ranked **ITA** is nominated.

The top three teams of Pan American Championship 2004 **URU**, **BRA** and **ARG** qualify. As **URU** and **ARG** withdrew the 2nd ranked team of Asian Championship 2004 **HKG** and 7th ranked of European Championship 2004 **HUN** are nominated.
